- 1. Check battery cables for wear, cracks, fraying, loose clamps, excessive corrosion, etc...
- 2. Attach red clamp (positive) to positive lead or post of uncharged battery.
- 3. Attach red Clamp (positive) to positive lead or post of charged battery.
- 4. Attach black clamp (negative) to negative lead or post of charged battery.
- 5. Attach black clamp (negative) to any paint free, metal part of the frame or sheet metal.
- 6. Start boosting vehicle and idle up if possible.
- 7. Start vehicle to be boosted.
- 8. If dead vehicle won't start, check connections and wait 5-10 minutes.
- 9. Attempt to start vehicle again.
