<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The workplace must be provided with equipment that meets the requirements of the standards and regulations. 2. All machines should be constructed and maintained so that while running at full or idle speed and with the largest attachment it is free of excessive noise and harmful vibration. 3. All machines except mobile or portable ones should be leveled and if necessary vibration dampened. 4. All machines should be securely fastened to the floor or other suitable foundation to eliminate movement/walking. 5. Small units should be secured to benches or stands of adequate strength and design. 6. Arbors and mandrels should be constructed to ensure a firm and secure bearing and free from slip or play. 7. Loose clothing, long hair and jewelry should not be worn around rotating parts and pinch points. 8. Adjustments should not be made if at all possible while the machine is running.
