| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Operate truck according to Semi &amp; Tandem Truck Operating Procedure.</li> <li>2. Check operation of end dump, gate &amp; hoist.</li> <li>3. Proceed to loading area.</li> <li>4. Put truck in park.</li> <li>5. Stay in truck while being loaded, keep an eye on load in rear-view.</li> <li>6. Wait for signal from loader before moving from loading area.</li> <li>7. Ensure truck is not overloaded.</li> <li>8. Tarp load.</li> <li>9. Proceed to dump area, obey all traffic regulation on way.</li> <li>10. Dump according to Unloading Granular Procedure.</li> </ol> |  |   |   |  |
