<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Inspect grinder for any required repairs or defects. 2. Check area surrounding work site and remove any flammable material. 3. Insure all guards are in place. 4. If portable grinder insure power switch is off before plugging in. 5. Turn grinder on and proceed by applying steady even pressure. 6. Ensure that any sparks or materials are dispersed away from you. 7. Be cautious of the hot surface on the piece you are grinding. 8. When job is done turn off grinder and clean up mess.
