- 1. Inspect grinder for any required repairs or defects.
- 2. Check area surrounding work site and remove any flammable material.
- 3. Insure all guards are in place.
- 4. If portable grinder insure power switch is off before plugging in.
- 5. Turn grinder on and proceed by applying steady even pressure.
- 6. Ensure that any sparks or materials are dispersed away from you.
- 7. Be cautious of the hot surface on the piece you are grinding.
- 8. When job is done turn off grinder and clean up mess.
