| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Stop everything. 2. Call Management, Safety rep. or Foreman. 3. Management, Safety rep. or Foreman to initiate response procedure and call 911 if necessary. 4. Ensure that equipment involved is not moved and incident/accident scene is not disturbed unless by not doing so compromised safety. 5. In case of an injury, allow personnel trained in First Aid to take care of casualty victims as soon as possible. 6. Ensure the casualty is not moved unless a greater and imminent danger will arise by leaving them in original position and location. 7. If the site is remote or hard to locate, have someone to go out to the street or roadway to flag in the emergency vehicles. 8. Upon emergency vehicle arrival, inform and assist personnel as required. 9. After assessment and statements have been taken follow instructions for foreman. | | | |
