1. Read and understand the operator's manual.					
2. Ensure the operator has adequate training.					
3. Ensure the operator has been given clear instructions.					
<ol> <li>A pre op inspection must be completed.</li> </ol>					
5. Ensure the motor safety switch is OFF and locked out before repair or					
maintenance work is done on the machine.					
6. No machine should be oiled, cleaned or adjusted while the machine is running					
unless provisions have been made for this purpose.					
7. Safety devices must not be by-passed, blocked or tied down.					
8. Operators must ensure all guards are in place.					
9. Do not alter guards.					
10. Make only adjustments explained in the operator's manual. Lock out the machine					
if working in an unguarded area.					
11. No machine is to be left running unattended unless specifically designed for that					
purpose.					
12. Wait for the machine to stop. Do not try to stop by hand or other device.					
13. Before clearing a jam ensure the power source is locked off.					
14. Make sure everyone is clear of the machine before starting.					
<ul><li>15. Adjusting tools or keys must not be left in machines.</li><li>16. Operators must not wear loose clothing and dangling jewelry and must tie back</li></ul>					
long hair.					
17. Machines must be clean and free of debris.					
18. Use proper brush or tool to clean machinery; do not use your hand.					
19. REPORT ANY DANGEROUS SITUATIONS TO THE SUPERVISOR.
