<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Engage hazard signals. 2. If truck placement is not immediately obvious, preform a walk through to check clearances and to familiarize with the job requirements, paying special attention to front, back, side and overhead hazards. 3. Ensure back-up beeper is in operation. 4. Clean windows and mirrors if required - align mirrors to enable maximum view to rear of truck. 5. All truck movements are to be made slowly. 6. Use a spotter whenever possible when moving a truck (forward or back) 7. Ensure that spotter understands appropriate hand and voice signals needed to facilitate communication. 8. If sight or eye contact with spotter is lost at any time, STOP immediately and reestablish contact before proceeding. 9. Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Distractions can lead to serious consequences.
