Perform a daily inspection of the roller ladder, ensure wheels turn easily, the brakes work properly, all welds are intact and the raising device works properly. 2. Defective ladders must be tagged out of service until repaired. 3. Before using ensure the brake is activated. 4. Ensure the ladder is the proper height for the job. 5. Ensure the steps are free of debris. 6. Do not climb on the guard rail of the rolling ladder. 7. Only use on a clear, even surface. 8. Always face the ladder when going up or down. 9. Ensure you have one free hand to hold onto the guard rail. 10. Never handle merchandise without being in a stable position. 11. Never move the ladder when someone is on it. 12. Never allow customers on the ladder. 13. When finished using always replace the bottom chain to block access to the ladder. 14. REPORT ANY DANGEROUS SITUATIONS TO THE SUPERVISOR.
