<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Do the pre-trip inspection including checking backup alarm, gauges and hydraulic. 2. Ensure truck and trailer is properly permitted, insured and has current safety. 3. Start truck. 4. Check all items on truck inspection report. 5. Fill out truck inspection report. 6. Report any defects needing immediate attention. 7. Let the truck warm up for a sufficient amount of time. 8. Wear seatbelt at all times. 9. Survey any job area entered for hazards. 10. Enter & exit truck using 3-point contact method. 11. Obey all traffic regulations at all times. 12. Ensure all loads are properly tarped. 13. Make use of spotter when backing and driving in tight areas. 14. Park on secure, level ground. 15. At end of day after parking lift box only 6 - 8 inches. 16. When finished operation for the day turn the Master Ignition Switch to the OFF position.
