<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Before work begins, discuss job to be done with all involved. 2. Secure the work area and survey for hazards. 3. Perform pre-trip inspection and record in log. 4. Enter machine using 3-point contact method and start. 5. Check back up alarm, all gauges, brakes and hydraulics. 6. Wear the seat belt and have the seat bar lowered at all times. 7. Turn on the beacon light. 8. In tight areas or where traffic is heavy use a spotter. 9. Load only what the skid steer can handle. 10. Always carry the bucket as low as possible. 11. Load, unload and turn on float, level ground. 12. Be aware of all people and obstructions in the operating area at all times. 13. When job is done park on level ground with attachments resting on the ground. 14. Park and secure machine. 15. Turn machine off. 16. When finished operation for the day turn the Master Ignition Switch to the OFF position. 16. Exit machine using 3-point contact.
