1. Obtain authorization for ladder usage if there is a possibility to fall more than 2 meters.

2. A second person may be needed to hold the ladder.

- 3. Ensure legs are locked in the open position.
- 4. Have both hands free to ascend or descend the ladder.
- 5. Always climb the ladder facing the rungs.
- 6. Work must be performed within arm's reach to avoid falling.
- 7. Do not work above another person or something that could further injure you if you fall .
- 8. Do not use power tools specifically designed to be operated with 2 hands.

9. Do not use tools requiring a high degree of leverage type force such as crowbars or pinch bars.

- 10. Use only insulated ladders for electrical work.
- 11. Do not walk the ladder while using it.
- 12. Do not use in the arc of a door opening or access area without barricading off the area.
- 13. Never use a step ladder on a table, chair or crate.
- 14. Always inspect and document inspection.
