- 4. Follow proper fueling procedures.
- 5. PPE must be worn at all times.
- 6. Keep away from moving parts. (engine, chains and sprockets).
- 7. Always operate from the driver's seat position. (right or left)
- 8. Check for pedestrians and bystanders.
- 9. Shoulder check when backing up. Check mirrors.
- 10. Never brush towards people or buildings.
- 11. Operate at a slow speed when on a slope.
- 12. Ensure the sweeper is on firm, level ground before raising hopper.
- 13. Parking brake must be on before raising or tilting the hopper.
- 14. Lower hopper to the transport position before moving.
- 15. Do not raise hopper under trees, bridges or electrical wires.
- 16. Post operation, park on firm, level ground, set park brake, lower hopper & remove key.
- 17. Check for signs of excessive wear or damage.
 - a. Repair or replace damaged parts.
